# Ksan Society: What we do and How we do it

- Guided by a trauma informed, anti-oppression, feminist philosophy, we challenge thinking, actions, and systems that contribute to violence against women, children, and men.
- We empower, assist, and support people experiencing gender violence, poverty, homelessness, and other forms of oppression and/or marginalization. We provide several types of safe housing opportunities and supports, shelters, food security and anti-violence programming.
- Some of the questions we ask ourselves:
  - How can we do our work in ways that recognizes the power and influence we have?
  - How can we make our services as accessible as possible?
  - How can we respect and recognize the local territories on which we do our work?
  - What does it mean to do anti-violence work in a colonial society?

# Ksan Society operates 26 programs

## Who we support:

- Every person we serve has experienced some trauma in their lifetime. Be it a single trauma or complex and compounded, we strive to be prepared to assist in as much capacity as we can
- Each person presents in different ways and uses their own unique strategies to cope. We use a trauma informed approach to accept where each person is at and provide a space for those presenting with life challenges such as homelessness and substance use problems, and for victims of crime such as intimate partner violence, childhood trauma, and sexual assault.

## Gaps in our Services:

- Support for personal activities of daily living.
- Capacity to safely assist someone who is detoxing
- Free, accessible trauma counselling for men
- Trauma counselling for children. We do provide psychoeducational counselling for children and youth who experience violence in the home
- Multicultural outreach services and support for women and men to complete legal documents for court
- Specialized training in Mental Health & Substance use problems
